In a communications emergency, monitor W1AW
for special bulletins as follows: Voice on the
hour, Teleprinter at 15 minutes past the hour,
and CW on the half hour.

All licensed amateurs may operate the station
from 1500 UTC to 1700 UTC (10 AM to 12 PM
EST), and then from 1800 UTC to 2045 UTC (1 PM
to 3:45 PM EST) Monday through Friday. Be
sure to bring your current FCC amateur radio
license or a photocopy.

NCVEC Releases New Technician Class Question
Pool

The Question Pool Committee (QPC) of the
National Conference of Volunteer Examiner
Coordinators (NCVEC) released the new
Technician class (Element 2) question pool on
Monday, January 4. This new question pool will
become effective for all examinations
administered on or after July 1, 2010; it will
remain valid until June 30, 2014.

The current Technician question pool that
became effective July 1, 2006 will expire June
30, 2010.

The new Technician pool contains approximately
400 questions, from which 35 are selected for
an Element 2 examination; it will contain

graphics and diagrams, something new for this
element.

The current General class question pool was
effective July 1, 2007 and is valid through
June 30, 2011.

The current Amateur Extra class pool was
effective July 1, 2008 and is valid until June
30, 2012.

2009 Sees Surge of New Amateur Radio Licensees

This past year was a banner year for new
Amateur Radio licensees. According to ARRL VEC
Manager Maria Somma, AB1FM, the FCC issued more
than 30,000 new ham radio licenses. "In 2009,
the demand for Amateur Radio exam sessions
remained elevated and is still running at a
higher rate than before the FCC's restructuring
of the license requirements in 2007," Somma
said. "This high level of exam session activity
has produced an elevated influx of new
applications, far outpacing recent years."

A total of 30,144 new licenses were granted in
2009, an increase of almost 7.5 percent from
2008. In 2005, 16,368 new hams joined Amateur
Radio's ranks; just five years later, that
number had increased by almost 14,000 -- a
whopping 84 percent! The ARRL VEC is one of 14
VECs who administer Amateur Radio license exams.

"When looking at the statistics over the last
10 years, these are some of the highest numbers
we've seen," Somma explained. "Additionally,
our total number of licensees across all three
classes has grown each year." Currently there
are 682,500 licensed Amateur Radio operators in
the US, an almost 3 percent rise over 2008. In
2008, there were 663,500 licensed amateurs;
there were 655,800 in 2007. Broken down by
license class, at the end of 2009 there were
17,084 Novices, 334,245 Technicians, 150,970
Generals, 60,795 Advanced and 119,403 Amateur
Extra licensees.

"The ARRL VEC has been busy meeting the needs
of the Amateur Radio community by helping
people to become radio amateurs or upgrade
their existing licenses," Somma said. "In 2009,
ARRL VEs administered 44,595 exam elements at
6369 ARRL VEC-sponsored exam sessions. The
number of amateurs who want to be Volunteer
Examiners and who want to teach Amateur Radio
classes is also going up -- we've seen a spike
in the number of applications from General and
Extra class radio amateurs who want to give
back to their community by serving as ARRL
examiners and instructors."

Somma applauded all the volunteers whose "hard
work and contribution of countless hours of
time helps to ensure the future of Amateur

Radio. The ARRL VEC thanks our 32,411 VEs from around the world whose dedication and service helped to contribute to the success of Amateur Radio. I am delighted by these important achievements. 2009 was a very good year for Amateur Radio and I am excited by the promise of 2010."

Haitian Agency Announces Contact Information for Amateurs going to Haiti to Provide Disaster Relief

The offices of CONATEL -- Haiti's national telecommunications regulator -- were destroyed in the January 12 earthquake that devastated the island nation. This office, like the FCC in the US, administers the Amateur Radio communications in Haiti. Hams interested in traveling to Haiti to help provide communications support have been at a loss as to whom to contact. CONATEL has set up temporary offices in a Port-au-Prince suburb and has indicated that those volunteers who wish to operate in Haiti to assist with disaster relief need to contact the agency to get formal operating clearance.

In an official release, CONATEL said that their new office -- located at 97 Avenue Panaméricaine in Pétionville -- will continue trying to rebuild the country's communications infrastructure and place the agency in a position where it can better coordinate the establishment of a temporary emergency telecommunications network in Haiti.

Amateurs who wish to travel to Haiti to help provide communications support need to contact CONATEL in one of three ways before any use of telecommunications equipment or the spectrum resources:

- * In person between the hours of 9 AM-1 PM at their new offices.

- * By telephone at 3454-0541, 2516-0000 or 3702-1414. If dialing from the United States, the phone call must be preceded with the international calling code 011 and the Haitian country code 509.

- * By e-mail at techommunication@yahoo.fr or info@conatel.gouv.ht.

"We hope to avoid interference problems and possible conflicts between the incumbent operators established in Haiti and those who are newly operating in this unusual circumstance," said CONATEL Director Général Montaigne Marcelin. Marcelin survived the earthquake, but two of his staff did not and several other employees are injured.

"Every aspect of life in Haiti has been terribly affected by the devastating

earthquake, and the communications sector is no exception," said FCC Chairman Julius Genachowski. "The immediate issues of concern are continuity of service by existing telecommunications companies, which are providing essential communications for Haitians and the disaster relief efforts, and their ongoing operational challenges such as access to fuel and security. Haiti also can benefit from deployment of temporary communications in the country, including at refugee sites. Many companies have made significant offers of help, and urgent efforts are underway to coordinate and deliver assistance."

IARU Region 2 Releases Frequencies

According to IARU Region 2 Emergency Communications Coordinator Cesar Pio Santos, HR2P, the communications situation in Haiti is improving. As such, he has released the HF frequencies, including 7.045 and 3.720 MHz, for normal use. "We thank the world radio amateur community for their support in keeping these frequencies clear during the past days," he said.

ARRL Sends Ham Aid Equipment to Haiti

While the communications infrastructure in earthquake-ravaged Haiti is being rebuilt, there is need for Amateur Radio communications. To assist in this effort, the ARRL's Ham Aid program is providing equipment for local amateurs to use. On Friday, January 22, the League sent a programmed Yaesu VHF repeater with a microphone, as well as ICOM handheld transceivers, Yaesu mobile 2 meter rigs with power supplies and Kenwood mobile 2 meter rigs. Comet antennas, Larsen mobile antennas with magnet mounts, coax and batteries were also included in the package. Most items were donated by their manufacturers; the repeater and power supplies were purchased by the ARRL several years ago using post-Hurricane Katrina grant funds.

"Now we are facing another devastating event in Haiti and Amateur Radio is ready to respond," said ARRL Chief Development Officer Mary Hobart, K1MMH. "With equipment contributed by our generous industry partners, the ARRL invites contributions to the Ham Aid Fund from hams who wish to help ARRL deploy equipment where it is needed most. Contributions from Amateur Radio clubs and individuals in any amount will go directly to supporting Amateur Radio's response efforts in Haiti."

Hobart explained that the easiest way to get your donation to work is to give via credit card on the ARRL's secure Web site. Checks may be made payable to ARRL Ham Aid and sent to 225 Main St, Newington CT 06111.
